### **New Temple for Goddess Sharada in Kashmir**

Located 40 kilometers from the Sharada Temple, the Sarvajna Peetha.

A testimony to Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya's efforts to unify the Nation.

On February 3, 2022, members of the Sharada Yatra (Sarvajna Peeth) Temple Committee, Kashmir, under the leadership of Sri Ravinder Pandita, visited Sringeri. They had Darshan of Goddess Sharada, Dakshinamnaya Sringeri Sharada Peethadhishwara Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Mahasannidhanam Sri Sri Bharati Tirtha Mahaswamiji and Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Sannidhanam Sri Sri Vidhushekhara Bharati Mahaswamiji, and sought blessings and guidance for the construction of the new temple for Goddess Sharada in Kashmir. The new temple would be constructed in the town of Teetwal, near the LoC in Kashmir, about 40 kilometers from the Sharada (Sarvajna) Peetha of the Goddess Sharadamba temple in Kashmir. The Sringeri Jagadgurus blessed the core members of the Committee and stated that all the required support would be extended towards this noble initiative.

### India's Unifying Force: Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya



There is no doubt that we are now able to live as a practitioner of the Hindu religion, or Sanatana Dharma, solely due to the yeoman service rendered by Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya who incarnated on this earth 1200 years back. Even at a young age, Sri Shankara mastered several languages. By the age of eight. He mastered all the four Vedas. Shunning aside all self-centered inclinations, He sought to strive for the welfare of others. He

became a renunciate (embraced sannyasa-ashrama) at the age of eight. Even from that tender age, as His tiny Feet walked India's land, He engaged in His mission to rejuvenate and restore the country's sanctity. Concerned solely with the welfare of the nation and all human beings, He made light of all difficulties and challenges that confronted Him. This is indeed befitting, because the great Acharya shines as the very epitome of vairagya (dispassion).

His first travel by foot commenced from Kalady, Kerala and culminated on the banks of the river Narmada in Madhya Pradesh, spanning a journey of nearly 1700 kilometers! In this day and age, with state-of-the-art infrastructure and Express Highways, journeying this stretch by road on a vehicle takes about 36 hours. How long would the journey have taken back in Sri Shankara's time, as He walked through dense forests?

On the banks of the Narmada, Sri Shankara first had Darshan of His Guru, Sri Govinda Bhagavatpada, took Krama Sannyasa from the Guru and studied the Shastras under him. By the age of twelve. He assimilated the import of all Shastras and, absorbed in the non-dualistic (Advaitic) principle as declared in the Upanishads. By the age of sixteen, He authored profound commentaries for the Brahmasutras, Upanishads and the Bhagavad Gita, referred to as the Prasthana-Traya. Further, He authored many independent treatises (called 'Prakarana Grantha) that help to easily understand the import of the Vedanta-Shastra; and also several stotras (devotional hymns to various deities) that serve to lead man along the path of devotion.

By quoting and reinforcing the Vedic declaration that there is only one Paramatma who manifests in varied forms such as Vishnu, Shiva, Devi etc. to bless devotees, Sri Shankaracharya served to integrate different factions of the society. Traversing the length and breadth of our country thrice, solely by foot, He propagated the Advaitic principle everywhere. Further, intending that the principles of Dharma and Vedanta must be propagated to people at all times, He established four Amnaya Peethams in four directions of India. This has been stated in the Matha-Amnaya Stotra as:

cakāra saṃjñāmācāryaścaturāṃ nāmabhedataḥ |
kṣetraṃ ca devatāṃ caiva śaktiṃ tīrthaṃ pṛthakpṛthak || 2 ||

He established the four Peethams in Puri in the East, Sringeri in the South, Dwaraka in the West and Badari in the North; and appointed the foremost of His disciples, namely Sri Hastamalakacharya, Sri Sureshwaracharya, Sri Padmapadacharya and Sri Totakacharya as their









respective Heads. He also determined the Devata-Shakti (presiding deity), the associated Kshetra (place of pilgrimage), Tirtha (sacred source of water) and the Maha-Vakya for each Peetham.

Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya is relevant to every follower of the Hindu Dharma. Through His divine powers, He rendered assistance to the poor and needy. He is fittingly revered even to this day by the entire nation, as He served to eradicate divisive factors and brought about unity across India, by propagating and nurturing the treasured Vedic norms all across the country. He rectified worship rituals and procedures across several temples in India. By establishing set procedures for Tirtha Yatras (holy pilgrimages) spanning all four directions in India, He brought forth a sense of unity and compatibility amongst one and all.

He appointed a native of the Chola region (part of present-day Tamil Nadu) to hold a position of importance in Gujarat, and natives of Kerala natives to significant positions in Kedarnath and



Badrinath this tradition continues to this day. Likewise, as instituted by Sri Shankaracharya, we still see natives of Karnataka hold important positions in Nepal and natives of the Maharashtra region are appointed to significant positions in Rameshwaram. In this way. He paved the way for people to think 'I am an Indian (first) and thus facilitated the socio-cultural integration of the entire nation.

### The Sarvajna-Peetham in Kashmir

'Sri Madhaviya Shankara Digvijaya' is regarded by the four Amnaya Peethams as the authoritative text on the glorious life history of Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankara. This work has been composed by the 12th Acharya of the Dakshinamnaya Sringeri Sharada Peetham, Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Vidyaranya Mahaswamiji. In this work, Jagadguru Sri Vidyaranya Mahaswamiji states:

On this earth, Jambudvipa is supreme. Within the Jambudvipa, Bharata (India) is sacred. Within India, the region of Kashmir which is presided by Goddess Sharada, the Goddess of Knowledge and Speech (Vagdevi) is eminent. A temple with four entrances, one in each of the four directions, established in Kashmir as the abode of Goddess Sharada, is well-known as the 'Sarvajna Peetham, Only a Sarvajna (Omniscient One) is eligible to occupy this Throne of Omniscience, none else.

Once when the Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Adi Shankaracharya was traversing the country, He came to know about this Sarvajna-Peetham (the seat of Omniscience) associated with Goddess Sharada in Kashmir. While scholars from three directions had opened the doors to the Sarvajna-Peetham and ascended the Throne through the respective entrances, the southern entrance, however, had not been opened till then.

To address this shortcoming (with respect to the Sarvajna-Peetham) that confronted Southern India, Sri Shankaracharya who hailed from Kerala, travelled to Kashmir, engaged eminent scholars of various philosophical schools in debate, delivered fitting responses to all questions, responded even to the divine voice of Goddess Sharada that posed a question to Him, and then ascended the Sarvajna-Peetham

### Kashmir and Sringeri

There has been a long-standing relationship between Kashmir and Sringeri, dating back to the era of the Puranas. Maharshi Kashyapa performed penance in Kashmir. His son. Maharshi Vibhandaka, and his grandson, Maharshi Rishyashringa, performed penance in Sringeri. According to the ancient Nilamata Purana, the region of Kashmir owes its origin to Lord Adi Varaha. Therefore, a part of the region was also referred to as Varahamula. Even to this day, a well-known place by name 'Baramulla' exists in Kashmir. Along similar lines, the mountain where the River Tungabhadra, which flows through Sringeri, originates is called Varaha Parvata. The Skanda Purana states that the River Tungabhadra originates from the tusk of Lord Varaha.

On seeing two natural enemies, the snake and the frog letting go of all animosity and living amicably, Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya felt that the region was extremely sacred, and chose it to establish the first of His four Amnaya Peethams, the Dakshinamnaya Sri Sharada Peetham, at Sringeri. He consecrated Goddess Sharada upon the Sri Chakra Yantra and worshipped the Goddess. The Matha-Amnaya Stotra says:

मलहानिकरं लिङ्गं विभाण्डक-सुपूजितम् । यत्रास्ते ऋष्यशृङ्गस्य महर्षराश्रमो महान् ॥ वराहो देवता तत्र रामक्षेत्रमुदाहृतम् । तीर्थं च तुङ्गभद्राख्यं शक्तिः श्रीशारदेति च ॥



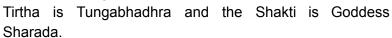


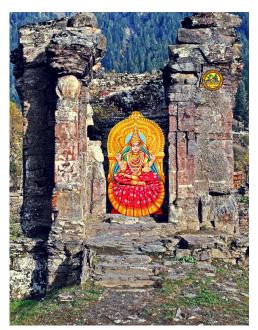

It means: Lord Varaha is the deity for the southern Peetham where Maharishi Vibhandaka worshiped the Malahanikareshwara Linga. This region was also the hermitage of Maharishi Rishyashringa. The Kshetra associated with the Sringeri Sharada Peetham is Rameswaram, the





Goddess Sharada, the Parashakti who is manifest as Goddesses Durga-Lakshmi-Saraswati was consecrated by Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankara in Sringeri.

Further, a longstanding Guru-Shishya association has prevailed between the Jagadgurus of Sringeri and the royalty of Kashmir. One of the letters submitted in 1919 by the then Maharaja of Kashmir, Pratap Simha, to the 34th Jagadguru of the Sringeri Sharada Peetham, Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Chandrashekhara Bharati Mahaswamiji, bears testimony to this association. In the letter, the Maharaja had expressed gratitude for receiving the Vyasa-Akshata from the Jagadguru.

The 35th Jagadguru of the Sringeri Sharada Peetham, Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Sri Abhinava Vidya Tirtha Mahaswamiji graced Kashmir in June 1967 during His

pan-India Dharma Vijaya Yatra and copiously blessed the people of Kashmir through His benedictory messages and the Chandramoulishwara Puja. The Jagadguru also had Darshan at the Shankaracharya Hill and offered worship to Lord Jyeshteshwara. During the Jagadguru's camp, an Archaka from Rameswaram, Seturamanath Abhyankar, visited Kashmir to receive Shiva Deeksha and Mantropadesha from the Jagadguru. He was blessed with Shiva Deeksha on June 12, 1967 and thus made qualified to offer Puja to Sri Ramanatha Swamy at Rameswaram. This event is illustrative of the national unity that has continued to prevail even a thousand years after it was initiated by Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya, and is also indicative of the close ties prevailing between Sringeri and the regions of Kashmir, Rameshwaram and Maharashtra. As per the procedure established by Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankaracharya, only the Sringeri Jagadgurus and Maharashtra Archakas who have received Shiva Deeksha from the Sringeri Jagadgurus are eligible to perform worship at the shrine of Sri Ramanatha Swamy; this tradition continues to this date

The current Acharya of the Sringeri Sharada Peetham, Jagadguru sgankaracharya Sri Sri Bharati Tirtha Mahaswamiji, during His all-India tour in 1994, graced Kashmir. On October 27, the Jagadguru visited the Adi Shankaracharya Hill, offered worship to Lord Jyeshteshwara and prayed for the welfare of all humanity.

Thus the association between Kashmir and Sringeri has endured for a long time.

### The Sharada Temple in Kashmir

As per age-old tradition, spanning several hundreds of years, the people of Kashmir, the erstwhile eminent seat of learning that hosted a multitude of accomplished scholars, used to embark on the 'Chari Mubarak Yatra every year, to the Sharada Sarvajna Peeth and to offer worship to Goddess Sharada. However, this temple now lies in ruins, and is currently located in Pakistan-occupied-Kashmir (PoK). For several years now, the people of Kashmir have been attempting to secure special permission to visit this temple.

In view of the prevailing situation, a new temple for Goddess Sharada will be constructed in Teetwal, a town on the banks of the river Kishanganga near the LoC in Kashmir, situated in the erstwhile Yatra route, and located about 40 kms from the Sarvajna Peetham of the Sharada Temple. On February 3, members of Sharada Yatra (Sarvajna Peeth) Temple Committee, Kashmir led by Sri Ravinder Pandita, Sri Mohan K Mongha, Sri Rakesh Koul visited Sringeri and sought blessings and guidance of the Sringeri Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Mahasannidhanam Sri Sri Bharati Tirtha Mahaswamiji and Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Sannidhanam Sri Sri Vidhushekhara Bharati Mahaswamiji, During the visit, Sri Ravinder Pandita explained the activities of the committee along with the live visuals from the Sharada Sarvajna Peeth in PoK and from Teetwal. The Jagadgurus showered Their benevolent blessings and stated that all the required support would be extended towards this noble initiative.

During Darshan, Sri Ravinder Pandit made an offering of holy sand and two stones from the ancient structure of the Sarvajna Peetham in Kashmir. The Jagadguru blessed him with one of the stones to be placed in the site of the new temple. A book of 2000 pages preserved in the archives of the Sringeri Math named 'Kritya Ratnaakara', authored under the instruction of Maharaja Ranbir Singh of Kashmir (the predecessor of Maharaja Pratap Singh) and letters sent reverentially to the Sringeri Jagadgurus by the Kings of Kashmir were shown to the Committee. members. The Administrator of the Sringeri Math, announced the complete support of the Math towards construction of the temple for Goddess Sharada and conveyed that the Math would offer a new Panchaloha Vigraha (idol) of Goddess Sharada for consecration at the temple.

### Varshika Abhisheka at Sri Sharada temple, Teetwal, Kashmir

There is a unique and profound connection between the Dakshinamnaya Sri Sharada Peetham in Sringeri and the Sarvajna Peetham in Kashmir. Kashmir is renowned as the place of

Maharshi Kashyapa's Tapas. Sringeri is significant as the place where Maharshi Kashyapa's son, Maharshi Vibhandaka, and his grandson, Maharshi Rishyashringa, performed their Tapas.



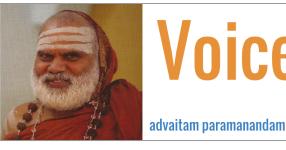
Jagadguru Sri Adi Shankara Bhagavatpada established the idol of Kashmirapura-vasini Sri Sharadamba at Sringeri and ascended the Sharada Sarvajna Peetham in Kashmir.

With the blessings of Sringeri Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Mahasannidhanam Sri Sri Bharati Tirtha Mahaswamiji, Jagadguru Shankaracharya Sri Sannidhanam Sri Sri Vidhushekhara Bharati Sannidhanam conducted the Pratishtha Kumbhabhisheka of Sri Sharada at Teetwal in Kashmir on Jyestha Krishna Pratipat (June 5, 2023).

In accordance with the ancient traditions of the Agama, The Sringeri Math, in collaboration with the Save Sharada Committee will organise the annual celebration (Varshika Abhisheka) of this historic Kumbhabhisheka at Teetwal from June 22-25, 2024.

After several centuries, the tradition of Shastrartha (scriptural debates) is experiencing a revival in the region of the Sarvajna Peetham in Kashmir, with discussions focusing on darshana-shastra-vichara. This event will honor the rich cultural heritage of Kashmir and strengthen roots of Sanatana Dharma in the reigon.

Over the four-day period, numerous dharmic activities will take place, including special Abhishekas, Pujas, Homas (Havans), Chaturveda Parayana, recitations of various Shastra texts, hymn chanting, scholarly lectures, debates, and discussions.

Shankaracharya in his avatar spanning 32 years has done many things. The can be categorised

- 1) Granth rachna, bhashya rachana, Stotras, prachand granth, vastavik tattva, Advaita siddhanta. An ordinary samanya man how he should live, he should behave/conduct with other people, these are the upadesh given by Shankaracharya.
- 2) visit every place. Avtar Purusha Shankaracharya Swami was born at Kalady,at the age of 8 he went to Omkareshwar on the banks of Narmada river in Madhya Pradesh, took sanyasa and thereafter went to Kasi, Badrinath and many places across the country. Wherever we visit in this country, we come across history related to Shankaracharya. We get to know how he solved problems in these places he visited. People who tread the wrong path got corrected & shown the right path. We get to know such things about Shankaracharya from Kanyakumari to Kashmir. He did digvijay yatra to various states, did betterment for the society.

\*Connection with Kashmir\*- in this state, Sarvajna Peetha is there. Shankaracharya ascended the throne there. One who's Sarvajna - all knowing, can only ascend the throne. One who's not cannot enter the temple. Hence after entering the temple, one has to prove his sarvajnata. Shankaracharya proved his sarvajnata and ascended the throne. He went everywhere and gave upadesh.

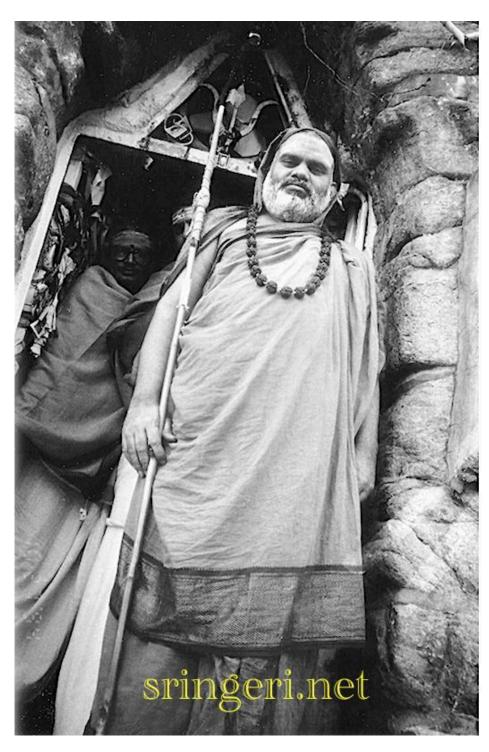
3) Established four aamnaya peethas in four directions in the country.











- Sringeri in South,
   Dakshinamaya
   Peetham, Sharada
   Peetham
- in West, Dwaraka
   Kalikamba Peeth
- in North, Jyothir Peeth (Badrinath)
- in East, Goverdhan Peeth (Puri)

Shankaracharya went to each of these places personally. One has to travel 2000 kilometres to go from one peeth and reach the other. Shankaracharya travelled by foot some 1200 years earlier. He did not establish 4, 10 or 15 peethas in one state in the country. That would have impeded the spread of culture throughout our country. Hence, he established the four peethas in locations at four directions in the country. By doing so he tried to solve regional disparities and bring unity (in thinking) among people of the country at various locations.
